



**ASAC Shohini S. Sinha
Portland Field Office**

Ms. Sinha received a Master's Degree in Mental Health Counseling from Purdue University in 1993 and a BA in Psychology from Purdue University in 1990. Prior to working for the FBI, Ms. Sinha was a Therapist and later an administrator for Family Services, Inc., a private, not-for-profit United Way Agency in Lafayette, Indiana.

Ms. Sinha entered on duty as a Special Agent (SA) of the FBI on December 30, 2001. From 2002 through 2009, SA Sinha was assigned to the Milwaukee Filed Office, where she worked Counterterrorism investigations. During this time, SA Sinha completed TDYs in GTMO, Legat London, and the Baghdad Operations Center. SA Sinha was also a Crisis Negotiator.

In 2009, SA Sinha was promoted to Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) and transferred to the Counterterrorism Division, International Operations Section II, Extraterritorial Investigations Unit III where she program managed Canada-based extraterritorial investigations and facilitated liaison with Washington-based Canadian Liaison Officers. The most notable achievement during SSA Sinha's tenure as a Supervisor was a joint investigation with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) which resulted in the arrest of three cell members in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada likely plotting to conduct attacks in the greater Ottawa area.

In 2012, SSA Sinha was promoted to Assistant Legal Attaché (ALAT) in the Legal Attaché office of the FBI in Ottawa, Canada. There, she worked Counterterrorism matters and advanced priority investigations of the FBI in collaboration with the RCMP and the Canadian Security Intelligence Service. The most notable achievement during ALAT Sinha's tenure as an ALAT was a joint investigation with the RCMP which resulted in the arrest of two terrorist cell members plotting an attack against the commercial rail line running between New York City and Toronto. The subjects were convicted of substantive terrorism charges in Canada.

In 2015, ALAT Sinha was promoted to Field Supervisor in the Detroit Field Office where she led CT-11, the squad responsible for investigating Hizballah and other Sh'ia extremists groups. During her tenure, CT-11 successfully disrupted four priority subjects. In January 2020, SSA Sinha transferred to the Cyber Intrusion squad which worked both National Security and Criminal Cyber Intrusion matters.

In August 2020, SSA Sinha was selected as Assistant Special Agent in Charge for National Security matters in the Portland Field Office. ASAC Sinha is married and has two cats.
